LEGAL ADVOCACY

After the last occasion, a substantial progress in the matter of Dr Aarti Lalchandani took place. The Hon'ble Allahabad High Court reprimanded the State Government for not submitting their Action Taken Report against the erring doctor. As the last opportunity, the State has been directed to file their progress report in the instant matter. However, Additional Advocate General appearing on behalf of the State tried to rest assure the Hon'ble Bench in the their following words:-

"Disciplinary Action is being contemplated against the erring officer-respondent no.8." Internet copy of the order dated 01.10.2020 is thus attached herewith for kind perusal. This matter is posted for 18.11.2020 hopefully for final disposal.

**SPECIAL REQUEST TO THE
MUSALLEES WHO PRAY IN THE MASAJID**

Due to the lockdown since two and a half months, there were restrictions placed on performing prayers by the public in the Masjid. Now, Alhamdulillah since the Govt. of India has granted permission for opening of Masjid for prayers in most of the states, we welcome the decision taken. In order to pray in the Masjid, the Musallees should adopt all Medical and preventive measures in addition to the following instructions:

- While standing for Salah, please keep a distance of at least 3 feet between the Musallees.
- The Musallees are requested to come to Masjid with Wudhu.
- The management of the Masjid may arrange for checking the temperature of the Musallees.
- The Musallees are suggested to use sanitizer while entering and exiting the Masjid.
- Special attention should be given to cleanliness and hygiene.
- Please ensure wearing of mask.
- For the people who are above the age of 65 and children below the age of 10 years, it is advisable not to come to the Masjid.
- People who suffer from cough, cold and high temperature should not come to the Masjid, and they may pray at home.
- Banners, posters, etc. pertaining to the instructions of Covid-19 may be displayed in the premises of the Masjid and all the Musallees are requested to follow the instructions issued by the Health and Family Welfare Department of the Govt. of India.

- नमाजियों से मस्जिद में वजू के साथ आने की अपील की जाती है।
- मस्जिद प्रशासन से अपील की है कि वह नमाजियों के लिए टेम्परेचर के चेकिंग की व्यवस्था करें जिससे सदिध लोगों के स्वास्थ्य का देखभाल किया जा सके।
- नमाजियों से मस्जिद के एंजिन और एंटी गेट पर सैनिटाइजर का इस्तेमाल करने की अपील की जाती है।
- सफाई सुधारों को लेकर के विशेष प्रबंधन करने की अपील की है। सफाई इस्लाम में आधा ईमान है, हम नमाजियों से अपील करते हैं कि सफाई का खास ख्याल रखें।
- नमाजी मास्क पहनने को यकीनी बनाएं।
- 65 साल से ऊपर के व्यक्तियों और 10 साल से नीचे के बच्चों को मशवरा दिया जाता है कि वह मस्जिद आने से बचें। घर पर ही नमाज की पाबंदी करें।
- सर्दी खासी जुकाम और हाई टेम्परेचर वाले व्यक्तियों से अपील है कि वह अपने स्वास्थ्य का विशेष ध्यान रखें और नमाज घर पर ही पढ़ें।
- मस्जिद प्रशासन से अपील की है कि वह बैनर पोस्टर इत्यादि माध्यमों से कोरोना को लेकर के जागरूकता फैलाएं। मस्जिद प्रशासन और नमाजियों से अपील की है कि वह भारत सरकार द्वारा दी गई गाइडलाइन का पूरी इमानदारी के साथ पालन करें जैसा कि उन्होंने पहले भी किया है।

New Delhi: Hailing the Allahabad High Court judgement clearing Dr Kafel Khan of all charges under NSA, Indian Muslims for Progress and Reform (IMPAR) on Tuesday sought accountability and punishment for those illegally framing him and jailing him without the person having committed any crime.

IMPAR also demanded compensation to the victim for the torture, loss of dignity and suffering caused to his family.

"We call upon the authorities to chalk out ways for safeguarding individuals' integrity so that no whimsical or politically motivated arrests happen in future," IMPAR said in a statement here after the High Court ordered immediate release of Dr Khan saying his detention was illegal as his speech for which he was booked under NSA promoted no hatred and violence.

Pointing out that the Court has held that Dr. Kafel Khan's speech at the Allgah Muslim University on December 13, 2019, amidst the anti-CAA protests, that led to his arrest and detention thereafter, does not disclose any effort to instigate hate speech against any community or the government, IMPAR said it was high time that such legal and politically motivated actions were not allowed to destroy the life of innocent persons.





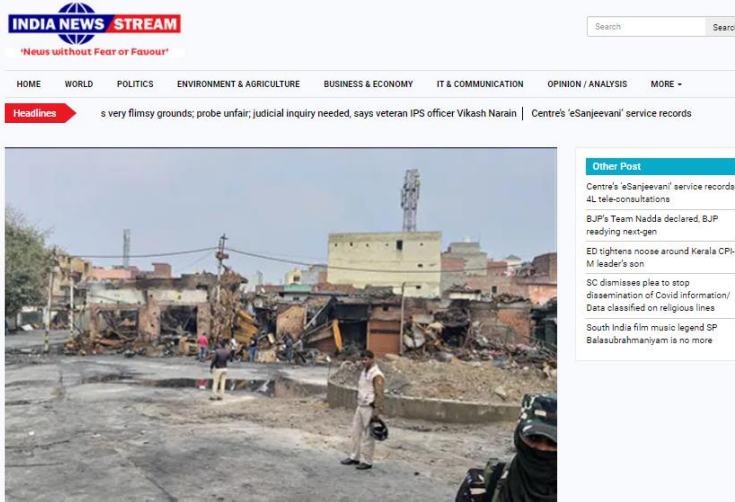

Indian Agriculture And The New Deal For The Farmers

At the time of independence, the urban-rural income ratio was estimated to be 2:1. It consistently declined and is now roughly 7:1 with agriculture accounting for approximately 12% @ \$415 billion in the India's GDP of \$2.6 Trillion. Agriculture is supporting 50% population with 12% share of GDP India attained self-sufficiency or surplus across various agro commodities during the last 10-15 years, except the oilseeds. But, our policies continued to be production centric and did not shift to post production gamut of activities with times, namely processing, value addition, supply chain, marketing, trade etc? While India contributes roughly 8% to the global farm GDP @ \$5 trillion, but its share in the trade is just 2% @ \$9 billion, out of a global trade of \$1.5 trillion. While our farmers produced enough and made the nation food proud, were we able to ensure fair and remunerative prices for the farmers?

India has one of the most diversified food production systems in the world. But our level of food processing continues to be approximately 5%, compared to 50% plus in developed countries. This is despite the fact that India is a leading and surplus producer of food grains in the world. India is also the top producer of milk, pulses, ginger, bananas, guavas, papayas and mangoes.

What have we done to address this? And could the Government on its own be able to organise the financial resources and technologies needed for post harvest infrastructure? The answer is certainly in the negative, which means, it requires private sector participation and partnerships for investments in infrastructure development, logistics, supply chain, processing, agribusinesses and trade. But, private sector can never invest in an over regulated system, which the present scenario, before the three agri legislations, presented. So what were the options before the Government and what are the global experiences before us. And the opinions of

the experts and expert committees constituted from time to time for this purpose? It can be said without an iota of doubt that the world over, farm sector could unleash its potential only after the marketing reforms were carried out. The best example is of China, where President Deng Xiaoping introduced agri marketing reforms in 1980 and that transformed the China's farm sector with boost to processing, agribusinesses, post harvest infrastructure and trade. While all experts are on board that we need to create favourable conditions through progressive policies and reforms to attract investments and partnerships to unleash the potential of agribusinesses and entrepreneurs for accelerated growth and value creation in farm sector, the benefits of which to be shared by all stakeholders, but importantly by the principal partner, i.e. farmer.

Then what are the concerns of the farmers and why are they agitating? Is there anything patently wrong in these bills or is there misunderstanding and simply apprehensions created about these bills. After studying the bills and talking to experts and cross sections of people, I realised that initially it was more due to the misunderstanding by the farmers due to lack of dialogue with them, but later certain interests got into it, fuelling the agitations. The key concern being expressed by the farmers is that the MSP may go away and the key demand being put forth is that no one should be allowed by law to buy below MSP. They want these two demands to be factored into the legislations. Although both are new demands, and were never part of the law, but being the executive decisions. The Government may however still like to consider the same by factoring the concerns in the rules to be framed or through some suitable administrative measures to win over the full trust of farmers.
