It is now working on broad long term goals of community reforms, leadership programs, entrepreneurship development, and social, political and economic empowerment. To empower the Indian Muslim community to contribute to the society and the nation

MISSION

SCOPE

Muslims in India number approximately 200 million, representing roughly 15% of the population, but their share in social, economic and political opportunity is disproportionately low—estimated to be near 3-5%. This has been a cause of serious concern for a long time. Though concerted efforts have been made in the past to bring about positive change, the situation remains unchanged. There are also new challenges emerging related to the image and perception of Muslims. The political agenda and issues of biases, excesses and unfairness by authorities are also reported in the media from time to time. This necessitates the need for proactive engagement with all stakeholders to create better understanding and a more socially congenial environment on one hand and policy advocacy and outreach to Government, social and political institutions.

Background:

Indian Muslims are at the crossroads, facing a plethora of challenges, from low representation in education and employment, to increased social, political and economic marginalisation. The community also faces challenges in cultural identity regarding the image and perception of Indian Muslims, which can affect their physical safety and security, and even their access to basic amenities and social welfare programs. The negative global developments also have an adverse impact on the community's image and wellbeing.

Widening the educational and economic opportunities in a cost-effective manner for its citizens is a national goal. We can only achieve positive changes for the community through internal reforms, approached with a modern outlook and increased positive social actions. And through the development of a favourable social and political environment, the community should be able to have greater access to educational and economic opportunities. Herein lies the need for the creation of a forum for research, monitoring, dialogue, coordination, engagement and data based policy advocacy and opportunity access programs for the Indian Muslim community.

IMPAR is the result of this long-felt need. However, its creation in April 2020 was an emergency response to deal with the Corona crisis, when over 500 prominent Muslims from different walks of life came together and founded it. IMPAR is working as the apex level national body for research and advocacy, strategic planning, coordinated actions, monitoring and response system and as development catalyst for Indian Muslims. IMPAR has delivered on all key challenges since its formation, and hopes to further accelerate its pace of delivery and performance.

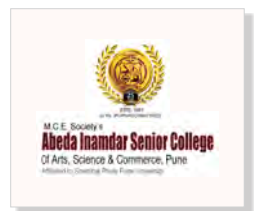
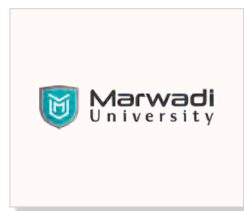
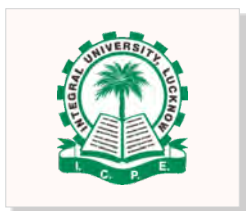

नईदिल्ली: COVID19 के खतरे को देखते हुए इंडियन मुस्लिम फॉर प्रोग्रेस एंड रीफॉर्म (इम्पार) ने ईद 2020 के लिए 11 बिंदुओं पर आधारित ईद गाइडलाइन जारी की है।

इम्पार के संयोजक और केंद्रीय समिति के सदस्य डॉ एमजे खान ने मुस्लिम समुदाय के सदस्यों को गरीबों, जरूरतमंदों, बयान में कहा गया है कि ये दिशानिर्देश ईद के आसपास सामाजिक जीवन के लगभग सभी क्षेत्रों को कवर करते हैं। इसमें दिशानिर्देशों के बारे में बात करते हुए, इम्पार केंद्रीय समिति के सदस्य और प्रसिद्ध उद्योगपति, श्री सईद शेखवानी ने कहा बयान में कहा गया है कि अब तक अंग्रेजी, उर्दू, हिंदी, बंगला, तमिल और मलयालम भाषाओं में लोगों को दिशानिर्देश जारी

"The priority of Zakat spending must be these people and not Madrasas or other such places. Zakat, which is paid during the holy month of Ramadan, should amount to 2.5 per cent of one's assets and is mandatory for all Muslims," said Dr M J Khari, Convener and Central Committee Member, IMPAR.

As Eid-ul-Fitr is less than ten days away, IMPAR, a platform that comprises of prominent Muslim personalities, issued the 11 point guidelines and asked people to observe that social distancing and austerity measures are adhered to.

These guidelines cover almost all spheres of social life around Eid. In addition, a few more good deeds have been mentioned like paying someone's 'achar' fees on Eid, paying somebody's rent, feeding a family and helping someone re-start the business.

Talking about the guidelines, Sagar Shrivastava, IMPAR Central Committee Member and noted industrialist said that we must fulfil all our extravagant spending this Eid and use that money to help the needy in this situation of crisis while adding that this is the essence of giving Zakat.

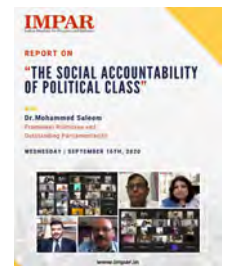
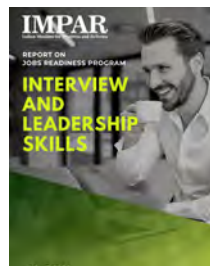
