IMPAR District Council

IMPAR District Council is the district level arm of IMPAR to act as the monitoring, engagement and coordination platform and to reach out to the community and engage with the key stakeholders effectively at district level to address the community concerns and roll out the social and economic programs and connect youth to opportunities. IMPAR District Councils are formed to achieve IMPAR's broader objectives and follow up on IMPAR's bigger role.

Objectives



Conducting research and collecting data on the Muslims' social, economic, and educational statuses in the district and their participation in flagship programs, and present the same to the district administration, various groups, and the media.



Analyzing media coverage, which has a direct and indirect impact on the well-being of the community, including its security and image, and preparing responses to be taken up with the media, social, and political spectrum and the district administration.



Dialogue with the District administration, media, political parties, corporate houses, and social and intellectual groups for sensitization and creating a better understanding of issues concerning Muslims.



Working on the community issues and agenda at the district level and building a database of Muslims in the district in key positions and professions such as media, law, health, education, business, trade, banks, politics, social work, administration, legislatures, and on.



Organize consultation meetings, seminars, discussions, leadership development programs and reward and recognition functions for the performers and achievers and various bodies, think tanks, media etc. in the district.



Establishing network of community service centres across the district and also create groups for executing various tasks from social work to awareness programs and institutional coordination with the Governmental bodies, banks, companies, educational and social institutions.



Educating youth and inculcating among them rational and scientific thinking, broad social and national ethos and shared values, and promoting social work and community service culture and the understanding of the essence of Islam.

Key Areas of Work

- Constituting IMPAR District Executive Committee, nominating prominent community persons from across the district, with a strength between 15-25.
- Setting up of IMPAR Community Development Centre at the district level.
- Setting up of IMPAR Information and Facilitation Centres at City/ Tehsil Level
- Engaging with various stakeholders – media, government, civil society organizations, development and educational institutions and eminent persons
- Connect with more and more prominent members of the community and line them up as members of IMPAR
- Monitoring opportunities in terms of government programs, welfare schemes, industry jobs, enterprises etc. and facilitate the community members access
- Coordination with district administration and various organisations to mobilise schemes and opportunities and facilitating community members to effectively accessing them.

Information Centres

Information Centres will engage community at city/ tehsil level for providing all types of information and facilitate the community. The Informationcentre will carry out following functions:

Provide information on **education, career planning, skill development, startup, scholarships, internship, loan** etc.

Provide support with online application (citizenship, scholarship, admission documents), a minimal fee could be charged.

Coordinate and facilitate on issues related to district administration and local social and political matters and extend needed counselling and support.

Engage youth in social activities. Plan and execute **cleanliness drive, community survey, awareness drive on education, girl/women education, health and hygiene, tree-plantation** or any other social issues.
